This revision replaces Bulletin No. 25 (Revised) TRANSFER COURSES ACCEPTABLE FOR CREDIT TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA, dated February 9, 1996. The content has been revised to reflect changes in Division policy or procedure.

I. INTRODUCTION

This bulletin identifies secondary high school courses that can be used to grant equivalent credit in the Division of Adult and Career Education. This bulletin is not to be used to determine adult school course equivalency for placement of concurrently enrolled students in the Division of Adult and Career Education.

II. COURSES TAKEN AT LOS ANGELES UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS

The high school program of the Division of Adult and Career Education is a competency-based program. Students from a secondary high school who possess equivalent credits in reading, English and mathematics, but do not demonstrate sufficient skills through appropriate placement instruments will be counseled accordingly.

The following Los Angeles Unified School District high school courses are acceptable for transfer to meet the requirements for the adult high school diploma of the Division of Adult and Career Education.
